 are allowed to receive the host [consecrated
 bread] or a fraction of the host only from their
 parents.
- Baptized children, ages 3-15, who regularly attend worship as members of the church, may receive communion in both kinds [consecrated bread and consecrated wine] through intinction after the parents or guardians of those children have met with the priest and given their consent for both kinds to be administered.
- All baptized persons, ages 16 and older, whether confirmed or not, may receive communion without permission from others.
