9:40 Peter put all of them outside, and then he knelt down and prayed. He turned to the body and said, "Tabitha, get up." Then she opened her eyes, and seeing Peter, she sat up.

9:41 He gave her his hand and helped her up. Then calling the saints and widows, he showed her to be alive.

9:42 This became known throughout Joppa, and many believed in the Lord.

9:43 Meanwhile, he stayed in Joppa for some time with a certain Simon, a tanner.

LEADER: For those who are struggling to raise children, who are tired and weary,

ALL: We pray that we may be their beloved community, offering real help in hard times.

LEADER: For those who recognise that they didn't live up to their responsibility as a mother and caregiver ALL: We pray that they will receive forgiveness and forgive themselves.

LEADER: For stepmothers, navigating the pitfalls and joys of creating a new family,

ALL: We pray for wisdom and patience.

LEADER: For grandmothers who are doing the hard work of raising children again,

ALL: We pray that the caregivers have those who care for them.

LEADER: For those waiting and sometimes struggling with the biological process to bring new life.

ALL: They that wait on the Lord shall renew their strength.

LEADER: For women who do not have children, but instead teach, lead, care for, and guide the children of others,
